### **Opening prayer**

Almighty God and Father,  
It is our certain faith that your Son, who died on the cross,  
was raised from the dead, the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep.  
Grant that through this mystery your servant N.,  
who has gone to his/her rest in Christ,  
may share in the joy of his resurrection.  
We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,  
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.  
Amen.

## Liturgy of the Word

### First reading

*A reading from the Prophet Isaiah 25:6-9*

On this mountain,  
the Lord of hosts will prepare for all peoples a banquet of rich food.  
On this mountain he will remove the mourning veil covering all peoples,  
and the shroud enwrapping all nations, he will destroy Death for ever.  
The Lord will wipe away the tears from every cheek;  
he will take away his people's shame everywhere on earth,  
for the Lord has said so.  
That day, it will be said: See, this is our God in whom we hoped for salvation;  
The Lord is the one in whom we hoped.
